Who We Are:

Tri-Valley CAREs works to promote global security by stopping the further development of nuclear weapons in the U.S. Tri-Valley CAREs was founded in 1983 in Livermore, California, by concerned neighbors living around the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL), one of two locations where all U.S. nuclear weapons are designed. Tri-Valley CAREs monitors nuclear weapons and environmental clean-up activities throughout the nuclear weapons complex, with a special focus on Livermore Lab and the surrounding communities.

Intern Description: Research alternative sustainable projects that Livermore Lab could conduct

- Research alternative employment options to nuclear weapons
- Research and create budgets for clean-up proposals for long term management of radioactive and hazardous waste
- Create fact sheets, tables and articles in conjunction with staff.

- Physics or chemistry background
- Team player and work in an atmosphere of consensus.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS: Tri-Valley CAREs is a multi-cultural organization and welcomes all applicants. Internships are non-paid and available on an on-going semester, quarter or Summer basis. Work schedules are designed to fit each intern's class schedule. Assigned tasks are tailored with an eye toward fulfilling internship credit requirements. The intern's personal areas of interest and study are taken into consideration when assigning tasks and work. Upon successful completion of an Internship, we offer interns letters of recommendation and assistance in finding other internships or work. Interns will need to provide their own transportation.
