

Public Hearing: Livermore Lab's Toxic Waste Permit

Key Facts

The hazardous waste permit for Livermore Lab is up for renewal. The Lab generates toxic, reactive, corrosive, ignitable, "mixed" **radioactive**, and other wastes.

If it is issued in its current form, this permit will authorize Livermore Lab to store up to **913,270 gallons of liquid and solid hazardous waste**. It will also allow the Lab to treat 600 tons of hazardous waste per year.

This permit will remain in effect for the next decade or longer. Your health could be endangered if the permit is vague, permissive or incomplete.
