WHAT: Meeting of the Tracy Advisory Committee on the Cleanup of Toxic & Radioactive Contaminants at the Livermore Lab's "Site 300" nuclear weapons experimental facility on Corral Hollow Road in Tracy. *The meeting is open to residents of Tracy and nearby communities in western San Joaquin County.*

MORE: The Tracy Advisory Committee is open to all Tracy area residents. The Tracy-based board members and community members of the non-profit organization Tri-Valley CAREs (Communities Against a Radioactive Environment) founded the committee in 2015. The advisory group meets regularly to inform and involve Tracy residents in decisions regarding the Superfund cleanup of soil and water at "Site 300" and to investigate waste management questions and the risks associated with a "Site 300" proposal to increase the size of toxic, open-air, high-explosives detonations with 121 hazardous constituents.
